Good afternoon,

After consultation with the school council, WHS put out a survey to collect data from the students and families of our grade tens and elevens regarding future grad dates at Wainwright High School.

The process of gathering stakeholder responses and the creation of the final survey was guided by the advice from and close work with Superintendent Rhae-Ann Holoien and Assistant Superintendent James Trodden. Wainwright High School thanks the support of our senior admin team in helping facilitate a process to not only hear the voices of the stakeholders but to collect some data to help inform a decision that our school council brought to our attention.

The survey was sent out on April 6, 2023 to 289 emails that are connected to our SwiftK12 system through the demographics information collected each year.

There were 78 responses. 48 were identified as from parents or guardians, 28 from students, 1 from "stakeholder" and 1 from "returning student".

The results show that the majority of the responses are not in support of a change in the traditional date that grad has been held at Wainwright High School.

The survey was closed on April 20, 2023. The results are attached.

Wainwright High School will honour the results of the survey and continue to hold the grad ceremony on the first weekend in the month of June.
